



Successes and Challenges



Successes

- Intense support for all stakeholders (VVST)
- Rapid pilot and reassessment of technology
- Data and dashboards to ID high performers (and low)
- Integrated team-based workflows
- Simple billing processes
- Leveraged for COVID-19 and non COVID-19 patients

Challenges

- Pediatrics and Geriatrics harder
- Variable payor policies
- Securing equipment early on
- Security and privacy

Important to Have Video Visit Options?*



√ 88% stated would be moderately, very, or extremely important



Risk and Mitigation: Privacy Standards



 Guidelines distributed July 27, 2020 to assure proper use of video equipment in exam rooms

- Key privacy and safety features:
 - Recording remains prohibited
 - Integrated video platforms have no recording option
 - Video visit of intimate exams is prohibited
 - In-room and outside-room large, visible
 signage during the visit
 - Physical coverings over cameras when not in use that are clearly labeled



Risk and Mitigation: Privacy Standards



Patients are able to clearly see if external video camera is on or off



 Physical coverings over cameras when not in use that are clearly labeled

Laptops with embedded cameras are clearly labeled and kept closed in exam rooms during in person exams
